WHAT IS AN E-PORTFOLIO?

E-portfolio is your personal, digital gallery of achievements.

This is a place where you can show your successes, projects, certificates and other important things you have achieved during your studies.

Unlike a traditional CV, an e-portfolio allows you to interactively present what you know and how you are developing.

E-portfolio is a modern, digital tool that allows students to document and present their educational journey.

It provides a dynamic gallery of achievements that differs from a traditional CV.

E-portfolio allows for a systematic and interactive presentation of a student's progress in learning and acquired skills.

Thanks to this platform, students can constantly update their documents by adding new certificates, diplomas, projects or multimedia that enrich their profile.





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HOW TO WORK WITH E-PORTFOLIO?

- Collect and add your achievements: You can put everything that shows what you have learned in an e-portfolio. Add certificates, diplomas, written works, projects, and photos and videos that show your skills.
- **Tell your story:** An e-portfolio is more than just a collection of documents. It's a way to tell your story how you're learning, what your goals are, and how you're achieving them. Think about how you want others to see your growth.
- **Update regularly:** Remember to add new things to your e-portfolio often. This way, it will always show what you can do now and what you are working on.
- Ask for feedback: Ask teachers, classmates, or mentors to look at your e-portfolio and tell you what they think. Their feedback can help you improve your work and make an even better impression.

- Content planning: Help students understand
 what elements should be included in an eportfolio. Examples include certificates, diplomas,
 projects, presentations, and multimedia such as
 videos or photos. These elements should reflect
 their progress in learning and the competencies
 they are developing.
- Creating a narrative: Encourage students to treat their e-portfolios not just as a collection of documents, but as a tool to tell their learning story. Help them create a narrative that shows their growth, their goals, and how they are working toward them.
- Regular Updates: Emphasize the importance of regularly updating e-portfolios. Students should frequently add new materials, update their achievements, and reflect. Regularly updating content helps keep the documentation in a state that reflects the current state of their skills and knowledge.
- Collect feedback: Encourage students to collect feedback from teachers, peers, or mentors on the content of their e-portfolio. Feedback can help improve and supplement the content, making the e-portfolio more complete



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WHY IS IT WORTH USING AN E-PORTFOLIO?
